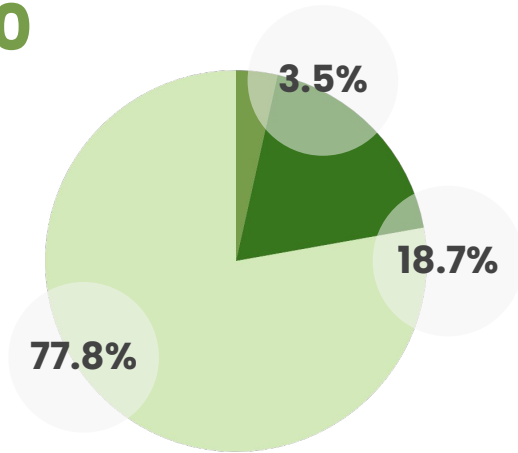

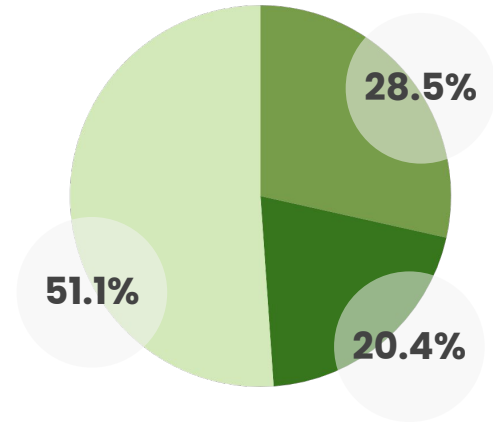

The University of Prince Edward Island has fall, winter, spring and summer semesters.

Classes are scheduled throughout the week, including weekends (program dependent), all year long.

The earliest classes begin at 8:30 am and evening classes can end as late as 10:00 pm.

There are two reading weeks, one in mid October (fall semester) and one in mid February (winter semester).
